One: The Old Testament prophet Isaiah tells us this: "Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold a young woman shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel."

All: Immanuel means "God with us." The prophet was speaking not about a God who is in some faraway place, but a God who is near us, who comes to be with us - in our work, our play, our times together as a family.



Spritual Formation

Children's Morning Fellowship, 9:15-10:15am: Led by Sunday school teacher Marina Greiner, children will gather for games, crafts, and music. Location: Children's Building, Room 2

Children's Sunday School, 10:45-11:30am: Immediately following the *Time With Young Disciples* in the morning worship service, children between the ages of 4 years old and 5th grade will be led to the Children's Building by Sunday school teacher Marina Greiner for their weekly lesson from *Growing in Grace and Gratitude*, important Bible stories that will encourage our children to grow into God's love and live as expressions of God's grace. Location: Children's Building, Room 2.

Nursery Care: The Northwest Nursery is located in Room 1 of the Children's Building. The nursery opens each Sunday morning from 9:00 to 11:45am, or at the conclusion of any after-church event. Children who are newborn through age 3 are welcome to attend the nursery where our professional nursery workers provide tender loving care. Parents, please bring diapers and a change of clothes and any medications needed (Epipen). Please do not bring foods containing nuts.

The Adult Sunday School classes will meet from 9:15-10:15am:

Adult Bible Class: This class will be co-led by Gray Norsworthy and AJ Shortley and will center its study on the gospel of John. The study will work through John's gospel focusing on a passage of scripture each week. There will be plenty of discussion and knowledge of the Bible is not a requirement.

Journey Class: This class explores a wide variety of topics and issues throughout the year in a series format. Series 4: November 26, December 3, 10, 17 - The Case for Christmas: Evidence for the Identity of Jesus. In this video Bible study, journalist Lee Strobel reveals what he discovered as he sought to separate the holiday of Christmas from the holy day, the facts from the fantasy, and the truth from the tradition. Participants will explore the following questions related to the Christmas story: What does the Bible actually say about Jesus' birth and how can you know that it is accurate? Did the Christmas story truly occur or was it just developed from legends? Was Jesus really born from a woman who was a virgin and why is this important? Did only Jesus fulfill dozens of biblical prophecies about the Messiah? The study will invite you to look beyond the familiar traditions of the season, challenge you to examine the evidence for yourself, and consider why Christmas really matters. Be Prepared to Stop

December 10, 2023

Mark 1:1-8, NRSV

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ.

As it is written in the prophet Isaiah,

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you,
who will prepare your way,
the voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord;
make his paths straight,'"

so John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And the whole Judean region and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him and were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the strap of his sandals. I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

1.	Be prepared to stop at certain moments in life


Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus 82


One stanza of this paraphrase of the great O Antiphons may be sung on each of the last days of Advent as follows:

Dec. 17: O Wisdom (2) Dec. 20: O Key of David (5) Dec. 23: O Emmanuel (1)

Dec. 18: O Lord of might (3) Dec. 21: O Dayspring (6)
Dec. 19: O Root of Jesse (4) Dec. 22: O Desire of Nations (7)

These titles of the coming Christ appeared in daily Vesper antiphons sung during the week before Christmas; their roots date at least to the reign of Charlemagne. Both text and tune are the fruit of 19th-century efforts to reclaim Christian treasures from pre-Reformation sources.


