

Book Discussion Lunches

This will be our last week of discussing the book *The Color of Compromise*. So far we have covered the church's role in racism in America from colonial slavery, through the Civil War and Jim Crow era, and on through the Civil Rights period. This last week we will discuss the development of our modern social/political context and where to go from here. If you were not able to join the group, you are encouraged to still read this book by Jemar Tisby. With incredibly thorough research, historical accuracy, and insight, Tisby discusses not only what the church has done through the years in relation to racial issues, but also why. As you can tell by the title of the book, Tisby makes a clear point that in regards to racism (as well as numerous other issues), the church and Christians often compromise the gospel and the way of Jesus due to the influence of the social and political forces of the day. However, Tisby does believe that like surgery, truth telling can be uncomfortable and even painful, but also healing and transforming.

The Bread of Life: Sunday School during Lent



During the weeks of Lent this year, from February 22 – Palm Sunday on March 29, we will be gathering in Thorington Hall at 9:00am for a light breakfast and discussion. Have you ever noticed how many times scripture refers to grain, yeast, and bread

baking? We will look at one of the passages each week and what we can learn about growing in our faith. There will be stories like Elijah and the Widow of Zarephath, God providing the Israelites with manna in the desert, and Jesus feeding the 5000. Along the way, our own Lisa Bacorn will give us some lessons in bread baking in ways that connect to our discussions. This should be interesting for all ages. Come and enjoy a little food and coffee, good fellowship, and stimulating conversation.
